Who May Use the Library?

Library services are available to all residents of the Ball-Chatham School District. Residents of Capital Township who are Lincoln Library Patrons may use our library using their Lincoln Library card.



How Do I Get A Card?

Library cards are issued at the Library free of charge. An I.D. with a current address is required. The original card will be renewed every three years at no cost. If your card is lost, there is a replacement fee of \$1.00.

Who Runs the Library?

An elected 7-member Board of Trustees manages the Library. A Director/Librarian supervises 7 full-time and 18 part-time librarians and 7 high school/college students.



Borrowing Policy

The number of items which a patron borrows is unlimited. However, the patron is responsible for every item borrowed until returned. Adult Reference materials may not be checked out. Items may be returned in the outside book drop or inside the Library.

Loan Periods

Books, magazines, audio books, music CDs and VHS/DVDs may be borrowed for 2 weeks. Puzzles may be checked out for 2 months.

Renewals

Most items from the Library may be renewed twice if there are no outstanding requests for the item. Interlibrary loan items may only be renewed once. You may renew in person, over the phone, or on the internet.

Fines

\$.05 per day on juvenile and young adult items, with a maximum of \$1.00 per item



\$.10 per day on adult materials, with a maximum of \$3.00 per item

What Services Do You Offer?

- ◆ A growing book collection of 75,000
- ◆ Borrowing within the Rolling Prairie Library System, including Lincoln Library
- ◆ Professional reference librarians that are happy to answer your questions in-person, through email or virtual reference.
- ◆ A quarterly newsletter detailing our programs, events and Library news.
- ◆ Large print books, the Illinois State Library's talking book collection, assistive technologies such as listening aides and video screen enhancers for patrons who are visually or hearing impaired.

Computer Lab

Patrons 16 years of age and older, and those 14 & 15 with waivers can use the Internet. Microsoft 2007 Office is also on each computer. Laptops are also available for in the library use.
